Welcome and Introduction	<p>Welcome to Sharon Henifin from Breast Friends and Amelia Mainard from NARA.</p>	
Updates	<p>Oregon BCCP: The web-based data system is currently being built and a test is scheduled for 3/21/2008! Getting 3-5 requests a week for new providers. Multnomah County wants to be a provider! Komen approved additional funding to BCCP for . BCCP is already beginning preparing for hiring 2 people.</p> <p>ACS- Cancer Resource Centers/Patient Navigator Cancer Resource Centers are in hospitals in: Salem, Bend, Medford, Eugene, Roseburg (coming soon), St. Vincent in Portland, Pacific Oncology and Good Samaritan in Portland. They have hired 3 patient navigators with a goal to serve 50 clients a week! May is the grand opening for the Cancer Resource center in Roseburg.</p> <p>ACS Reach to Recovery Peer to peer counseling is a program that has survivors helping other survivors. The program is less hospital based than in the past. There is training available for volunteers, and the trainers are based in Eugene, but are willing to travel. They are currently training a Portland based trainer. The program referrals have decreased in recent years due to a variety of things, such as doctors are not referring, hospitals are adding their own programs, and knowledge of the program has not transferred from one person to another when positions are vacated. How can the BHTF help? ACS wants to continue to the program. The referral form consists of basic data usually provided by the provider. Peer supporter/volunteers, talking to different populations to get volunteers for the program. The number is 1-800-227-2345. This program was hospital based originally. ACS does refer to other groups for longer support, such as Breast Friends. It would be helpful to get information into the hands of doctors and oncologists. Possibly link with WoWDHEC for women with disabilities.</p> <p>Question about accessibility of ACS website (this applies to all websites, too!) Aids for the disabled for the website include: screen reader, scripts for the videos. Member Updates	<p>ACS: Making Strides for Breast Cancer Walk May 10, Saturday. 2 and 4 mile walk, fundraiser.</p> <p>Breast Friends Fundraiser/ auction May 3 go to www.breastfriends.com to purchase tickets.</p> <p>Komen Issues Conference went very well and was sold out- 686 people! This year there was increased publicity and continuing education credits available. Next year they are planning on moving to a bigger venue. For the first time, there was an Issues Bus, (sponsored by Fred Meyer) that went from Medford, Salem, and Eugene and to Portland for the conference. There were 20 women on board. Lodging was provided as well as door to door service to the conference!</p> <p>OHSU Clinical Breast Exam Training- Did training for faculty (7) and patient instructors (13) and got many practitioners up to speed on new curriculum. Faculty is in Portland metro, Bend, Corvallis. Providers can sign up to take the training. The cost is \$350.00 per provider. This is a skills based, hands on training. BCCP program may add money in their budget for training for BCCP providers. This training was originally started with the BCC Program. OHSU requests a minimum of 2 providers in order to have faculty and PIs travel for training.
