<b>BCCP Program Update</b> (Elvin)	<p>Possible new CDC grant to partner with the BCCP program called Wise Woman. This program piggy backs onto the BCCP Program and enables women who are enrolled in the BCCP program to get screening for Blood Pressure and cholesterol. The women are placed 3 categories according to risk level and are then referred to an appropriate provider. The grant will begin around the first part of July (if it is awarded). <b>Right to Know</b> (Angela)	<p>Recap of CDC's Right to Know Campaign.. There was discussion of the goals. There was a conference call that went well and helped to confirm the program direction with the CDC and offer encouragement. There will be a CDC site visit 3/3-5. On March 4 there will be a partner meeting from noon to 4:00 for the Right to Know team. Discussion of incorporating other languages and cultures into the program, but the CDC has done no studies for this option. There is interest in creating materials for non-represented languages and cultures (e.g. Asian). A map is in the works that will show where centers are that have disabled access. <b>Review Action Items</b>	Action items were reviewed, 3 were deleted and 8 still remain and are in need of further attention.	
<b>Cancer Disparities Workgroup</b>	<p>The workgroup is not going to continue but disparities will be incorporated into all existing workgroups and placed on the agenda of all future meetings. Each group will take on the topic of disparities. The March 14 colorectal cancer partnership meeting will include disparities. The quarterly newsletter that comes out of May 1 will focus on disparities. A community meeting in June is also being planned with a focus on cancer disparities in the African American Community. Future meetings will be planned to set 1-2 tasks to focus on disparities. The workgroup created a resource for cancer materials in other languages that will be shared with this group for review and input. <b>Disabilities</b>	<p>survey conducted by the Public Health Division) and the process of the questions and how the survey is conducted. There are 4 surveys in all states and the questions are asked to that a minimum of 2 questions will be asked from each list (sample size ranges fro 3-5,000 on average each year). The cost to add questions is \$5000/per question. August is the deadline for questions for the following year. There was a discussion of doing our own survey and the logistics of doing a phone survey vs. an online survey. We can do phone, postal mail or an online survey.</p> <p>The current questions asked each year are 1. Are you limited in any way...2. Do you now have any health problem that requires you to use special equipment? The Office of Disability and Health has added follow-up questions: 1.How long have you have the condition; and 2. What is the nature of the disability (e.g. physical, sensory, cognitive)</p>	<p>RE the possibility of doing our own survey through disability organizations to establish baseline information</p>
<b>Breast Health Basics Materials</b>	<p>Feedback: PowerPoint too long and redundant about mammogram, CBE and breast self-exam. Possibly translate the PowerPoint into other languages. Possibly amend into shorter versions (e.g. 15, 30 and 60 minutes) and save them according to time.
